

BYLAWS

OF

HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION OF LEISURE COVE ON MARINA DRIVE (Amended March 2012)

ARTICLE I

NAME AND LOCATION

The name of the corporation is HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION OF LEISURE COVE ON MARINA DRIVE, hereinafter referred to as the "Association". The principal office of the corporation shall be located at Montgomery, Texas, but meetings of members and directors may be held at such places as may be designated by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE II

DEFINITIONS

- **Section 1. "Association"** shall mean and refer to HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION OF LEISURE COVE ON MARINA DRIVE, its successors and assigns.
- Section 2. "Lot" shall mean and refer to any plat of land identified as a Lot or tract on the plat of the Subdivision.
- **Section 3. "Owner"** shall mean and refer to the record owner, whether one or more persons or entities, of the fee simple title to any Lot or Lots which is a part of the Subdivision, including contract sellers, but excluding those having such interest merely as security for the performance of an obligation.
- **Section 4. "Declaration"** shall mean and refer to the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions applicable to the Subdivision and recorded in the Real Property of Montgomery County, Texas, under Clerk's File No. 2006-115389.
- **Section 5. "Member"** shall mean and refer to those persons entitled to membership as provided in the Declaration.

ARTICLE III

MEETINGS OF MEMBERS

Section 1. Annual Meeting. The first annual meeting of the Members shall be held one year from the date of incorporation of the Association, and each annual meeting of the Members shall



be held in December of each year thereafter, on a day and at an hour determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Members may be called at any time by the President or by the Board of Directors, or upon written request of the Members who are entitled to vote one-fourth (1/4) of all of the votes of the Class A Membership.

Section 3. Notice of Meetings. Written notice of the annual meeting and each special meeting of the Members shall be given by, or at the direction of, the Secretary or person authorized to call the meeting, by mailing a copy of such notice, postage prepaid, at least 10 days but no more than 60 days, before such meeting to each Member entitled to vote, addressed to the Member's address last appearing on the books of the Association, or supplied by such Member to the Association for the purpose of notice. Such notice shall specify the place, day and hour of the meeting, and, in the case of a special meeting the purpose of the meeting.

Section 4. Methods of Voting. The voting rights of a Member may be cast or given:

- (1) in person or by proxy at a meeting of the Association;
- (2) by absentee ballot; or
- (3) by electronic ballot by electronic mail or facsimile.

Absentee ballots may not be counted, even if properly delivered, if the Member attends any meeting to vote in person so that any vote cast at a meeting by the Member supersedes any vote submitted by absentee or electronic ballot previously submitted for that proposal. Absentee or electronic ballots may not be counted on the final vote of a proposal if the motion was amended at a meeting of the Members to be different from the exact language on the absentee or electronic ballot. Any solicitation for votes by absentee ballot by the Association must include an absentee ballot that contains each proposed action and provides an opportunity to vote for or against the proposed action, instructions for delivery of the completed absentee ballot, including the delivery location, all of which are required by Section 209.00592 of the Texas Property Code.

Section 5. Election Vote Tabulators. A person who is a candidate in an Association election or who is otherwise the subject of an Association vote, or a person related to that person within the third degree of consanguinity or affinity, as determined under Chapter 573 of the TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE, may not tabulate or otherwise be given access to the ballots cast in the election or vote.

Section 6. Recount Procedures. A Member may, not later than the fifteenth (15th) day after the date of a meeting at which an election was held, require a recount of votes in accordance with Section 209.0057 of the TEXAS PROPERTY CODE.

Section 7. Quorum. The presence at the meeting of Members and proxies eligible to cast one-third (1/3) of the votes of each class of membership shall constitute a quorum for any action except as otherwise provided in the Articles of Incorporation, the Declaration, or these Bylaws. Absentee and electronic ballots shall be counted as a member present and voting for items

appearing on any ballot. If however, such quorum shall not be present or represented at any meeting. the Members eligible to vote shall have power to adjourn the meeting from time to time, without notice other than announcement at the meeting, until a quorum as aforesaid shall be present or be represented.

Notwithstanding any other provision in these Bylaws, in the absence of a quorum at a meeting of Members, the meeting may be adjourned and immediately reconvened for the sole purpose of conducting Director elections. The quorum required for election of Directors at the reconvened meeting shall be the number of votes cast in person, by proxy, by absentee ballot, or electronic ballot.

Section 8. Proxies. All proxies shall be in writing and filed with the Secretary. Every proxy shall be revocable and shall automatically cease upon conveyance by the Member of his Lot.

Section 6. Action Without a Meeting of the Members. Any action which may be taken at a meeting of the Members may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action to be taken, shall be signed by all of the Members.

ARTICLE IV

BOARD OF DIRECTORS, SELECTION; TERM OF OFFICE

Section 1. Number. The affairs of this Association shall be managed by a Board of three (3) directors, who need not be Members of the Association. Members *or any other persons* with a felony conviction or a conviction for a crime involving moral turpitude are not eligible to serve.

Section 2. Term of Office. At the first annual meeting the Members shall elect one Director for a term of one year and two Directors for a term of two years: and at annual meetings thereafter, the Members shall elect Directors for two year terms as needed to restore Board membership to three Directors.

Section 3. Removal, Resignation or Death and Appointment of Successor. Any director may be removed from the Board, with or without cause, by a majority vote of the Members of the Association. A meeting to consider the removal of a director may be called and noticed following the procedures provided in these bylaws. The notice of the meeting shall state that the issue of possible removal of the director will be on the agenda.

In the event of death, resignation or removal of a director, his successor shall be selected by the remaining Members of the Board and shall serve for the unexpired term of his predecessor. At such time as all Lots in the Subdivision have been sold to Owners other than the Declaration, if Edward Windell, Mark Windell, or Matthew J. Schenck are still Directors, they shall tender to the Board their resignations as Directors, and their successors shall promptly be selected as above set forth.

Section 4 Compensation. No director shall receive compensation for any services he may render to the Association. However, any director may he reimbursed for his annual expenses incurred in the performance of his duties.

Section 5. Action Taken Without a Meeting. The directors shall have the right to take any action in the absence of a meeting which they could take at a meeting by obtaining the written approval of all the directors Any action so approved shall have the same effect as though taken at a meeting of the directors.

ARTICLE V

NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Nomination. Nomination for election to the Board of Directors shall be made by a Nominating Committee. Nominations may also be made from the floor at the annual meetings. The Nominating Committee shall consist of a Chairman, who shall be a member of the Board of Directors, and two or more Members of the Association. The Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors prior to each annual meeting of the Members, to serve from the clone of such annual meeting until the close of the next annual meeting and such appointment shall be announced at each annual meeting. The nominating Committee shall make as many nominations for election to the Board of Directors as it shall in its discretion determine to be appropriate but no less than the number of vacancies that are to be filled.

Section 2. Election. Election to the Board of Directors shall be by written and signed ballot. At such election the Members or their proxies may cast, in respect to each vacancy, as many votes as they are entitled to exercise under the provisions of the articles of incorporation and the Declaration. There shall be no cumulative voting. The person receiving the largest number of votes shall be elected.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Regular and Special Meetings. Regular and special Board meetings shall be open to Members, subject to the right of the Board to adjourn a meeting and reconvene in closed executive session to consider actions involving personnel, pending or threatened litigation, contract negotiations, enforcement actions, confidential communications with the property Association's attorney, matters involving the invasion of privacy of individual owners, or matters that are to remain confidential by request of the affected parties and agreement of the Board. Following any executive session, any decision made in the executive session shall be summarized orally and placed in the minutes, in general terms, without breaching the privacy of individual owners, violating any privilege, or disclosing information that was to remain confidential at the request of the affected parties. The oral summary shall include a general explanation of any expenditure approved in executive session.

Section 2. Notice of Meetings. Members shall be given notice of the date, hour, place, and general subject of a regular or special meeting of the Board, including a general description of any matter to be brought up for deliberation in executive session. The notice shall be (a) mailed to each Member not later than the tenth (10^{th}) day or earlier than the sixtieth (60^{th}) day before the date of the meeting; or (b) provided at least seventy-two (72) hours before the start of the meeting by (i) posting the notice in a conspicuous manner reasonably designed to provide notice to the Members in a place located on the Association's common property, or on conspicuously located private property within the subdivision, or (ii) by posting the notice on an Internet website maintained by the Association; and (iii) by sending the notice by e-mail to each owner who has registered an e-mail address with the Association.

Section 3. Meetings Without Notice. The Board, by any method of communication, including electronic and telephonic meetings, may meet without prior notice to Members, if each director may hear and be heard by every other director, or the Board may take action by unanimous written consent to consider routine and administrative matters or a reasonably unforeseen emergency or urgent necessity that requires immediate Board attention. The action taken without notice to the Members must be summarized orally, including an explanation of any known actual or estimated expenditures approved at the meeting, and documented in the minutes at the next regular or special meeting of the Board. Notwithstanding the authority to meet without notice to the Members, the Board may not, without prior notice to the Members, consider or vote on fines; damage assessments; initiation of foreclosure actions; initiation of enforcement actions, excluding temporary restraining orders or violations involving a threat to health or safety; increases in assessments; levying of special assessments; appeals from a denial of architectural control approval; or the suspension of a right of a particular Member before the Member has an opportunity to attend a Board meeting to present the Member's position, including any defense on the issue.

Section 4. Quorum. A majority of the number of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Every act or decision done or made by a majority of the Directors present at a duly held meeting at which a quorum is present shall be regarded as the act of the Board.

Section 5. Action Without a Meeting. Any action which may be taken at a meeting of the directors may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action to be taken, shall be signed by all the directors.

ARTICLE VII

POWER AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Powers. The Board of Directors shall have power to do the following:

(a) Adopt, amend, repeal and enforce Rules and Regulations and enforcement provisions as it deems necessary or desirable with respect to the interpretation and implementation of the Declaration, the operation of the Association, and the use of properties and lots within the Subdivision.

- (b) Exercise for the Association all powers, duties and authority vested in or delegated to this Association and not reserved to the membership by other provisions of these Bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation, or the Declaration.
- (c) Declare the office of a member of the Board of Directors to be vacant in the event such member shall be absent from three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the Board of Directors.
- (d) Employ a manager, an independent contractor, or such other employees as they deem necessary, and to prescribe their duties.

Section 2. Duties. It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to do the following:

- (a) Cause to be kept a complete record of all its acts amid corporate affairs.
- (b) As more fully provided in the Declaration to:
 - 1) Fix the amount of tile annual assessment against each Lot at least thirty (30) days in advance of each calendar year;
 - 2) Send written notice of each assessment to every Owner subject thereto at least thirty (30) days in advance of each annual assessment period; and
 - 3) Foreclose the lien against any property for which assessments are not paid or to bring an action at law against the owner personally obligated to pay the same, as it may deem appropriate.
- c) Issue, or to cause an appropriate officer to issue, upon demand by any person, a certificate setting forth whether or not an assessment has been paid. A reasonable charge may be made by the Board for the issuance of these certificates. If a certificate states an assessment has been paid, such certificate shall be conclusive evidence of such payment.
- d) Procure and maintain adequate liability and hazard insurance on any property owned by the Association.
- e) Cause all officers or employees having fiscal responsibilities to be bonded, as it may be deemed appropriate.

ARTICLE VIII

OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

Section 1. Enumeration of Offices. The officers of this Association shall be a president and vice-president, who shall at all times be members of the Board of Directors, a secretary, and a treasurer, and such or officers as the Board may from time to time by resolution create.

- **Section 2. Election of Officers.** The election of officers shall take place at the first meeting of the Board of Directors following each annual meeting of the Members.
- **Section 3. Term.** The officers of this Association shall be elected animally by the Board and each shall hold office for one (1) year unless he than sooner resign, or shall be removed, or otherwise disqualified to serve.
- **Section 4. Special Appointments.** The Board may elect such her officers as the affairs of the Association may require, each of whom shall hold office for such period, have such authority, and perform such duties as the Board may, from time to time, determine.
- Section 5. Resignation and Removal. Any officer may be removed from office with or without cause by the Board. Any officer may resign at any time giving written notice to the Board, the president or the secretary. Such resignation shall take effect on the date of receipt of such notice or at any later time specified therein, and unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- **Section 6. Vacancies.** A vacancy in any office may be filled by appointment by the Board. The officer appointed to such vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the term of the officer he replaces.
- **Section 7. Multiple Offices.** The offices of secretary and treasurer may be held by the same person. No person shall simultaneously hold more than one or any of the other offices except in the case of special offices created pursuant to Section 4 of this Article.

Section 8. Duties. The duties of the officers are as follows:

President

a) The president shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors: shall see that orders and resolutions of the Board are carried out; shall sign all leases, mortgages, deeds and other written instruments and shall co-sign all checks and promissory notes.

Vice-President

b) The vice-president shall act in the place and stead of the president in the event of his absence, inability or refusal to act, and shall exercise and discharge such other duties as may be required of him by the Board.

Secretary

c) The secretary shall record the notes and keep the minutes of all meetings and proceedings of the Board and of the Members; keep the corporate seal of the Association and affix it on all papers requiring said seal: serve notice of meetings of the Board and of the Members, keep appropriate current records showing the Members of the Association together with their addresses, and shall perform such her duties as required by the Board.

Treasurer

d) The treasurer shall receive and deposit in appropriate bank accounts all monies of the Association and shall disburse such funds as directed by resolution of the Board of Directors; shall sign all checks and promissory notes of the Association; keep proper books of account; cause a periodic review of the Association books to be made by a public accountant; and shall prepare an annual budget and a statement of income and expenditures to be presented to the membership at its regular annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

COMMITTEES

The Board of Directors may serve as the Architectural Control Committee or appoint an Architectural Control Committee, as provided in the Declaration, and a Nominating Committee, as provided by these Bylaws. The Board may designate one of the members of the Architectural Control Committee to act for the Committee without consulting the other ember. In addition, the Board of Directors shall appoint other committees as deemed appropriate in carrying out its purpose.

ARTICLE X

BOOKS AND RECORDS

The books, records and papers of the Association, and the Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws of the Association shall be available for inspection by any Member at the principal office of the Association, where copies may be purchased at reasonable cost, in accordance with the Association's Records Production Policy.

ARTICLE XI

INDEMNIFICATION

Each director and officer of the Corporation shall be indemnified by the Corporation against any costs and expenses including attorneys fees actually and necessarily incurred in connection with the defense of any civil. criminal, administrative or other claim, action, suit or proceeding (whether by or in the right of the Corporation or otherwise) in which he may become involved or with which he may be threatened, by reason of his being or having been a director or officer of the Corporation and against any payments in settlement of any such claim, action, suit or proceeding or in satisfaction of any related judgment, fine or penalty upon receipt by the Corporation and of opinion of independent legal counsel that he acted in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the interests of the Corporation, and in respect of any criminal action, what he reasonably believed that his conduct was lawful. The termination of any action, suit or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create an assumption that the

director or officer did not act in good faith and in a manner he reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to the best interest of the Corporation and in respect of any criminal action or proceeding, did not reasonably believe that his conduct was lawful. The foregoing indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which any director, as a matter of law or otherwise, both as to action in his official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding each office and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director or officer and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such a person.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding paragraph, no person shall be entitled to indemnification pursuant thereto in relation to any matter as to which indemnification shall not be permitted by law.

The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was an officer or director of the Corporation against any liability asserted against him and incurred by him in any such capacity, or arising out of his status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify him against such liability under the proceeding provisions of this Article or applicable provisions of law.

ARTICLE XII

PAST DUE ASSESSMENTS

As more fully provided in the Declaration, each Member is obligated to pay to the Association annual and special assessments which are secured by a continuing lien upon property against which the assessment is made. All assessments which are not paid when due shall be delinquent. If the assessment is not paid within (10) ten days after the due date, a late charge may be imposed. If the assessment is not paid within thirty (30) days after the due date, the assessment shall bear interest from the date of delinquency at the rate of the lesser of the rate eighteen per cent (18%) per annum or the maximum rate permitted by law, and interest, costs, and attorney's fees of any collection effort shall be added to the amount of such assessment.

The Association may bring an action at law against the Owner personally obligated to pay the same or foreclose the lien against the property. No Owner may waive or otherwise escape liability for the assessments provided for herein by nonuse of the Common Area or abandonment of his Lot.

ARTICLE XIII

AMENDMENTS

Section 1. These Bylaws may be amended by the Board of Directors.

Section 2. In the case of any conflict between the Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws, the Articles shall control; and in the case of any conflict between the Declaration and these Bylaws, the Declaration shall control.

ARTICLE XIV

MISCELLANEOUS

Tile fiscal year of the Association shall begin on the first day of January and end on the 31st day of December of every year.
